

Stephanie (Petkovsek) Kolosky – Augustana '15

Stephanie Kolosky was a four-year letter winner as a member of the Augustana women's volleyball team. Playing primarily at setter, Kolosky finished her career ranked 25th in school history with 258 set assists and 20th with 2.66 assists per game. She also had 69 blocks while playing in 54 matches and 97 games between 2011 and 2014. Additionally, she was named to the CCIW Academic All-Conference Team three times including 2012, 2013 and 2014. Currently, Kolosky is the Assistant Studio Manager at Orangetheory Fitness in Downers Grove.



Amanda (Croix) Patzke – Carthage '11

Amanda Patzke competed for four years on the Carthage women's swimming team and for three years on the Carthage water polo team. A 2017 inductee into the Carthage Athletics Hall of Fame, Patzke was the swimming program's first national champion, winning the 50-yard freestyle at the 2010 NCAA Division III Championship. She is a 12-time first team All-American, an eight-time honorable mention All-American, as well as a 24-time CCIW champion with 11 individual titles and 13 relay titles. Additionally, Patzke was named the 2009 and 2010 CCIW Most Valuable Swimmer and the 2011 CCIW Swimmer of the Year. She still holds four individual school records as well as two CCIW meet records and two CCIW Open records. Patzke qualified and competed at the U.S. Olympic Swim Trials in 2012 and was the assistant swim coach at West Point United States Military Academy from 2011-2013. Currently, Patzke is the Nurse Manager for Patient Care Services for Women and Infants at Ascension Health – St. Francis in Milwaukee. She oversees Labor & Delivery, Postpartum and Special Care Nursery Units.



Adam Dauksas – Illinois Wesleyan '06

Adam Dauksas was a four-year starter on the Illinois Wesleyan men's basketball team. He finished his career averaging 12.9 points per game and ranks first in school history with 584 career assists. The 2005 CCIW Fred Young Most Outstanding Player, Dauksas was a two-time D3hoops.com First Team All-American and was the starting point guard on a Titans team that finished third at the 2006 NCAA Division III Men's Basketball Championship. In 2010, he was named to the D3hoops.com All-Decade Team. Currently, Dauksas is a partner for the law firm of Scariano, Himes & Petrarca in Chicago.
