Welcome to the 2018 College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) Men's Lacrosse Tournament.

The CCIW enters the 2017-18 academic year as its 72nd season of competition, 32nd for women's sports.

During the 2016-17 academic year, the CCIW honored over 1,900 academic all-conference recipients, 10 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, 33 CoSIDA Academic All-District recipients, one CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year and over 100 all-Americans.

The CCIW, recognized as one of the "Best Small-College Conferences in the Nation," has seen its share of success throughout its time, with 51 NCAA Division III National Championships in 11 different sports won by the membership.

Since the 1991-92 academic year, the CCIW has remained consistent in its membership and welcomed back another former member in 2016-17. The CCIW consists of nine institutions, including Augustana, Carroll, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois Wesleyan, Millikin, North Central, North Park and

Wheaton. Carroll returned to the conference in 2016-17 after a 24-year absence.


