Welcome to the 2021 College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) Men's Volleyball Tournament.

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enters 2020-21 as its 75th season of competition, 35th for women's sports.

The CCIW, recognized as one of the "Best Small-College Conferences in the Nation," has seen its share of success throughout its time, with 55 NCAA Division III National Championships in 12 different sports won by the membership.

Since the 1991-92 academic year, the CCIW has remained consistent in its membership and welcomed back a former member in 2016. The CCIW consists of nine institutions, including Augustana, Carroll, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois Wesleyan, Millikin, North Central, North Park and Wheaton. Carroll returned to the conference for the 2016-17 academic year after a 24-year absence.

In 2014, the University of Dubuque joined the CCIW as an associate member for men's and women's lacrosse. The CCIW added three new associate members for wrestling
