Welcome Message

Welcome to the 2022 College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) Men's Volleyball Tournament.

The CCIW enters 2021-22 as its 76th season of competition, 36th for women's sports.

The CCIW, recognized as one of the "Best Small-College Conferences in the Nation," has seen its share of success throughout its time, with 57 NCAA Division III National Championships in 13 different sports won by the membership.

Since the 1991-92 academic year, the CCIW has remained consistent in its membership and welcomed back a former member in 2016. The CCIW consists of nine institutions, including Augustana, Carroll, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois Wesleyan, Millikin, North Central, North Park and Wheaton. Carroll returned to the conference for the 2016-17 academic year after a 24-year absence.

CCIW Sporting Behavior Statement

Individuals associated with the Conference are expected to conduct themselves with honesty, integrity and fair play. The CCIW added three new associate members for wrestling in 2016, including Lakeland University, Concordia-Wisconsin and the Milwaukee School of Engineering. The University of Chicago (women's lacrosse) and Washington University in St. Louis (football) joined the CCIW as associate members in 2018, while Loras College joined as an associate member when the conference added men's volleyball in 2019. Aurora University, Lakeland and Marian University all joined as associate members for women's bowling this season. Translyvania recently joined as an associate member for men's lacrosse and begins competing in the spring of 2022.

The CCIW, which sponsors 25 sports, has carried a long tradition of excellence dating back to its inception in 1946, helping student-athletes grow in their athletic as well as educational experience. The conference looks to continue that tradition and remains dedicated to helping our student-athletes towards success.
