Welcome to the 2019 College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) Women's Volleyball Tournament.

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enters 2019-20 as its 74th season of competition, 34th for women's sports.

During the 2018-19 academic year, the CCIW honored over 2,200 academic all-conference recipients, 18 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, 43 CoSIDA Academic All-District recipients, and over 100 all-Americans.

The CCIW, recognized as one of the "Best Small-College Conferences in the Nation," has seen its share of success throughout its time, with 54 NCAA Division III National Championships in 12 different sports won by the membership.

Since the 1991-92 academic year, the CCIW has remained consistent in its membership and welcomed back a former member in 2016. The CCIW consists of nine institutions, including Augustana, Carroll, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois Wesleyan, Millikin, North Central, North Park and Wheaton. Carroll returned to the conference for the 2016-17 academic year after a 24-year absence.

Regular participation by member institutions in NCAA regional and national competition is an ongoing conference goal.
