Welcome Message

Welcome to the 2020 College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) Women's Basketball Tournament.

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enters 2019-20 as its 74th season of competition, 34th for women's sports.

During the 2018-19 academic year, the CCIW honored over 2,200 academic all-conference recipients, 18 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, 43 CoSIDA Academic All-District recipients, and over 100 all-Americans.

The CCIW, recognized as one of the "Best Small-College Conferences in the Nation," has seen its share of success throughout its time, with 55 NCAA Division III National Championships in 12 different sports won by the membership.

Since the 1991-92 academic year, the CCIW has remained consistent in its membership and welcomed back a former member in 2016. The CCIW consists of nine institutions, including Augustana, Carroll, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois Wesleyan, Millikin, North Central, North Park and Wheaton. Carroll returned to the conference for the 2016-17 academic year after a 24-year absence.

In 2014, the University of Dubuque joined the CCIW as an associate member for men's and women's lacrosse. The CCIW added three new associate members for wrestling in 2016, including Lakeland University, Concordia-Wisconsin and the Milwaukee School of Engineering. The University of Chicago (women's lacrosse) and Washington University in St. Louis (football) joined the CCIW as associate members in 2018, while Greenville University and Loras College joined as associate members when the conference added men's volleyball in 2019..

The CCIW, which sponsors 24 sports, has carried a long tradition of excellence dating back to its inception in 1946, helping student-athletes grow in their athletic as well as educational experience. The conference looks to continue that tradition and remains dedicated to helping our student-athletes towards success.

On behalf of the CCIW and its member schools, we would like to thank you for your support and hope you enjoy your experience at all conference events.
