## Welcome Message

Welcome to the 2019 College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) Women's Tennis Automatic Qualifier Tournament.

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enters 2018-19 as its 73rd season of competition, 33rd for women's sports.

During the 2017-18 academic year, the CCIW honored over 2,000 academic all-conference recipients, 15 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, 28 CoSIDA Academic All-District recipients, and over 100 all-Americans.

The CCIW, recognized as one of the "Best Small College Conferences in the Nation," has seen its share of success throughout its time, with 53 NCAA Division III National Championships in 11 different sports won by the membership.

Since the 1991-92 academic year, the CCIW has remained consistent in its membership and welcomed back a former member in 2016. The CCIW consists of nine institutions, including Augustana, Carroll, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois Wesleyan, Millikin, North Central, North Park and Wheaton. Carroll returned to the conference for the 2016-17 academic year after a 24-year absence.

In 2014, the University of Dubuque joined the CCIW as an associate member for men's and women's lacrosse. The CCIW added three new associate members for wrestling in 2016, including Lakeland University, Concordia-Wisconsin and the Milwaukee School of Engineering. The University of Chicago (women's lacrosse) and Washington University in St. Louis (football) joined the CCIW as associate members in 2018.

The CCIW, which sponsors 23 sports, has carried a long tradition of excellence dating back to its inception in 1946, helping student-athletes grow in their athletic as well as educational experience. The conference looks to continue that tradition and remains dedicated to helping our student-athletes towards success.

The CCIW seeks to promote keen competition, the highest level of sportsmanship and the strongest performance possible in each sport. Regular participation by member institutions in NCAA regional and national competition is an ongoing conference goal.
