Welcome Message

Welcome to the 2017 College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) Women's Tennis Championship.

The CCIW enters the 2017-18 academic year as its 72nd season of competition, 32nd for women's sports.

During the 2016-17 academic year, the CCIW honored over 1,900 academic all-conference recipients, 10 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, 33 CoSIDA Academic All-District recipients, one CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year and over 100 all-Americans.

The CCIW, recognized as one of the "Best Small-College Conferences in the Nation," has seen its share of success throughout its time, with 50 NCAA Division III National Championships in 11 different sports won by the membership.

Since the 1991-92 academic year, the CCIW has remained consistent in its membership and welcomed back another former member in 2016-17. The CCIW consists of nine institutions, including Augustana, Carroll, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois Wesleyan, Millikin, North Central, North Park and Wheaton. Carroll returned to the conference in 2016-17 after a 24-year absence.

In 2014, the University of Dubuque joined the CCIW as an associate member for men's and women's lacrosse. The CCIW added three new associate members for wrestling in 2016, including Lakeland University, Concordia Wisconsin and the Milwaukee School of Engineering.

The University of Chicago (women's lacrosse) and Washington University in St. Louis (football) will join the CCIW as associate members beginning in 2018-19.

The CCIW, which sponsors 23 sports, has carried a long tradition of excellence dating back to its inception in 1946, helping student-athletes grow in their athletic as well as educational experience. The CCIW looks to continue that tradition and remains dedicated to helping our student-athletes towards success.

Teams are credited with two points for a first-round win, four points for a second-round win and three points for a win in the championship. No points are awarded for play-in match wins.

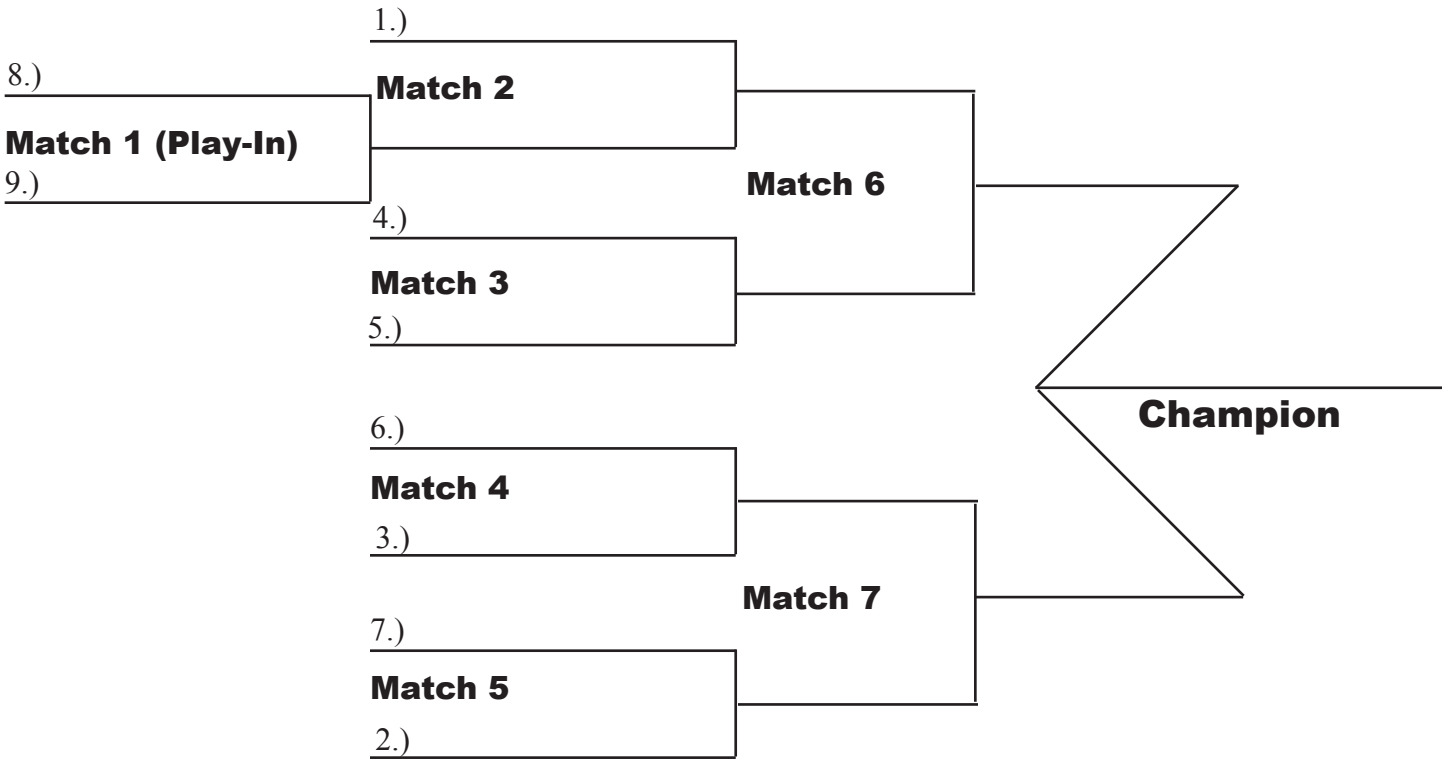
Teams are credited with one point for winning a match in the playback bracket.

Teams are credited with two points for winning a third-place match.

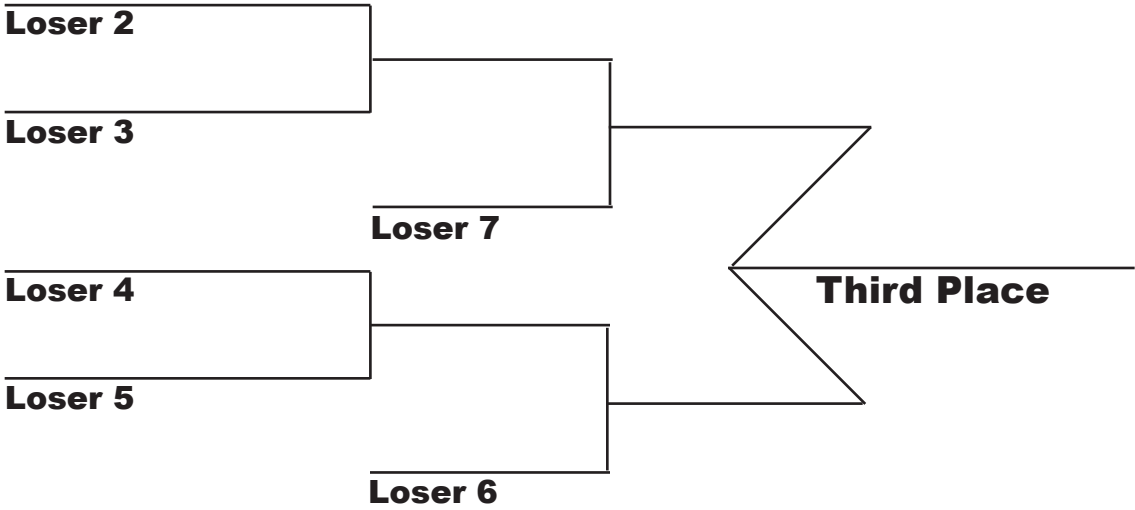
Note: The CCIW champion will be determined by using a combination of the regular-season dual meet standings and the CCIW championship results. Teams will be awarded points for where they finish in the CCIW regular season standings, taking into account only conference matches. This will account for one-third of the criteria. Teams will then be awarded points for where they finish in the CCIW championship standings (a team's place in the CCIW championship standings will be determined using the point system listed above). This will account for two-thirds of the criteria. The top four teams will advance to the CCIW Automatic Qualifier Tournament in May.

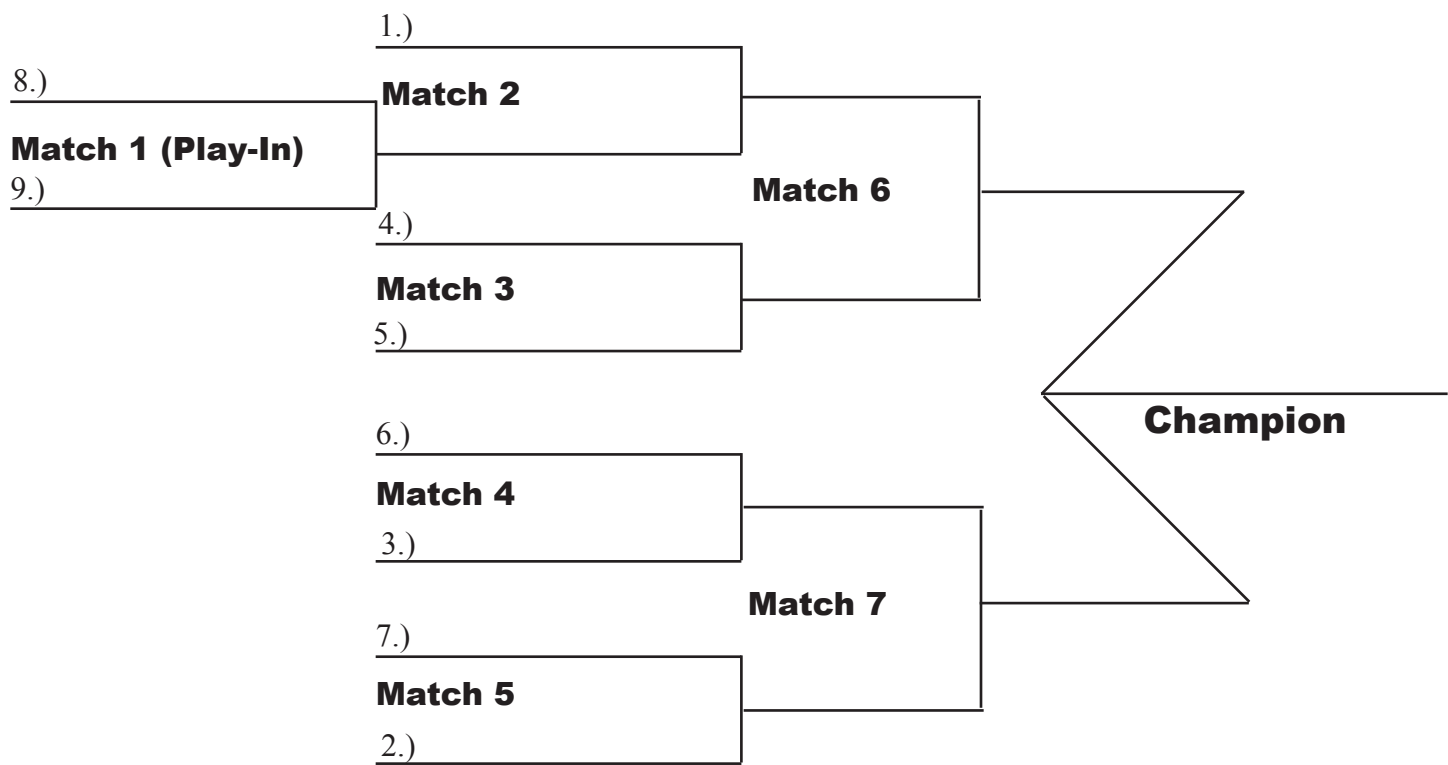

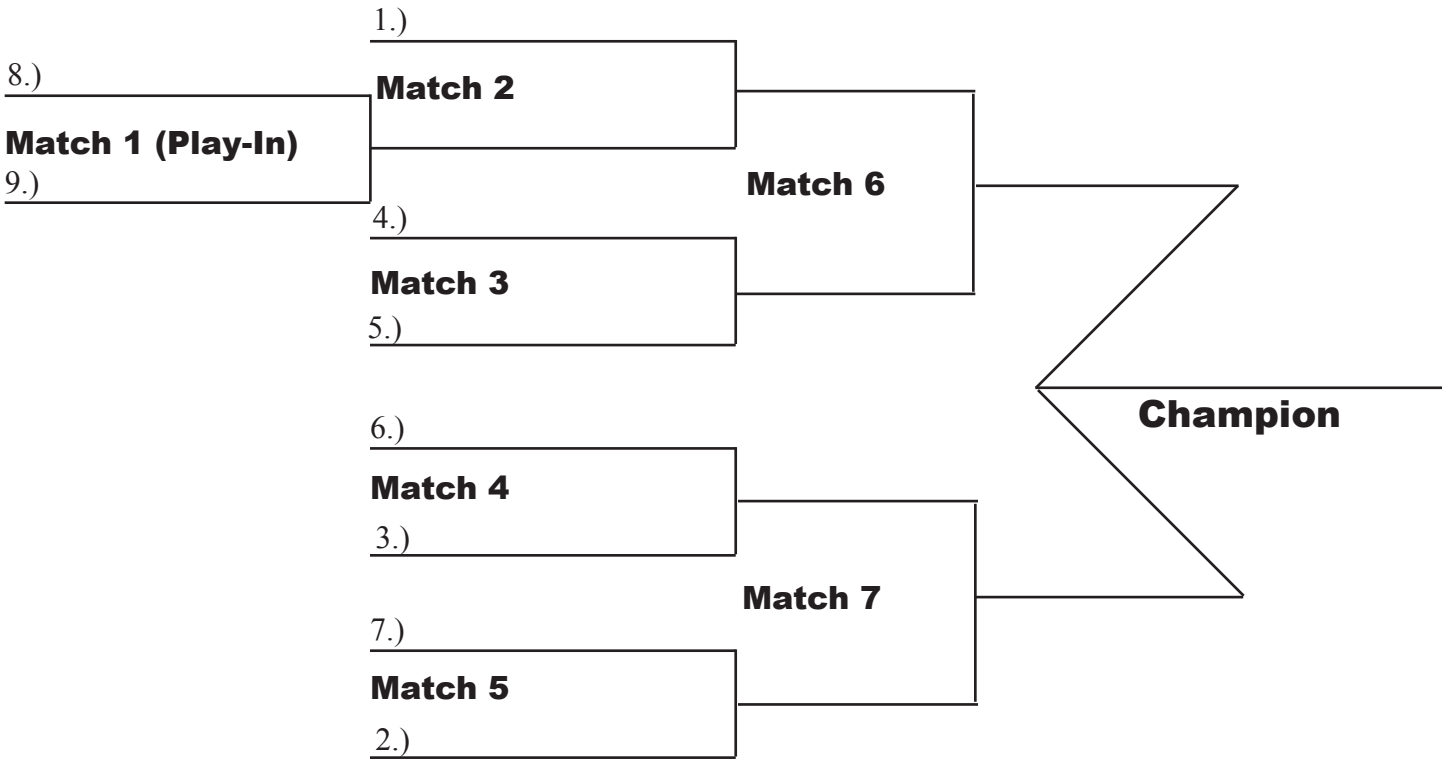

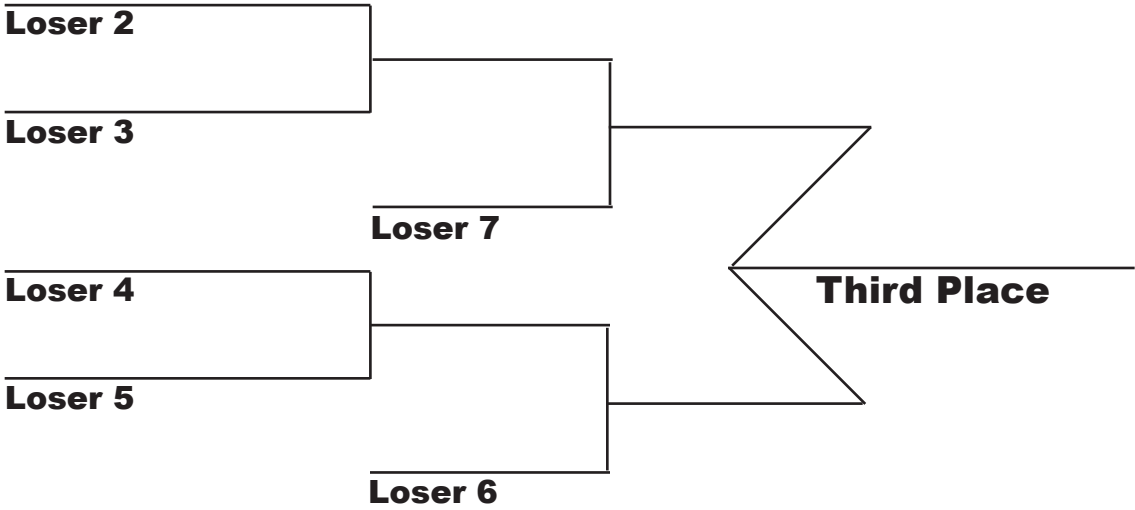

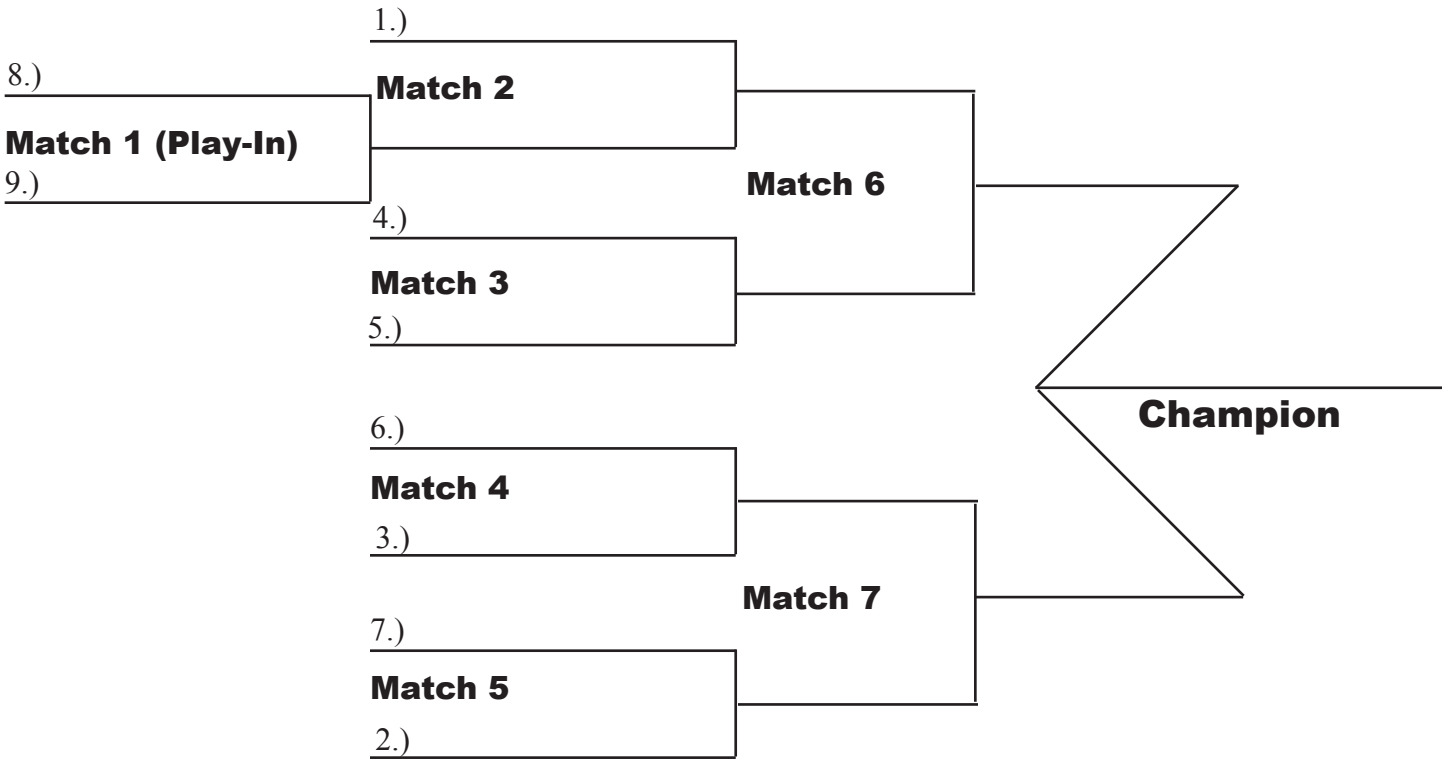

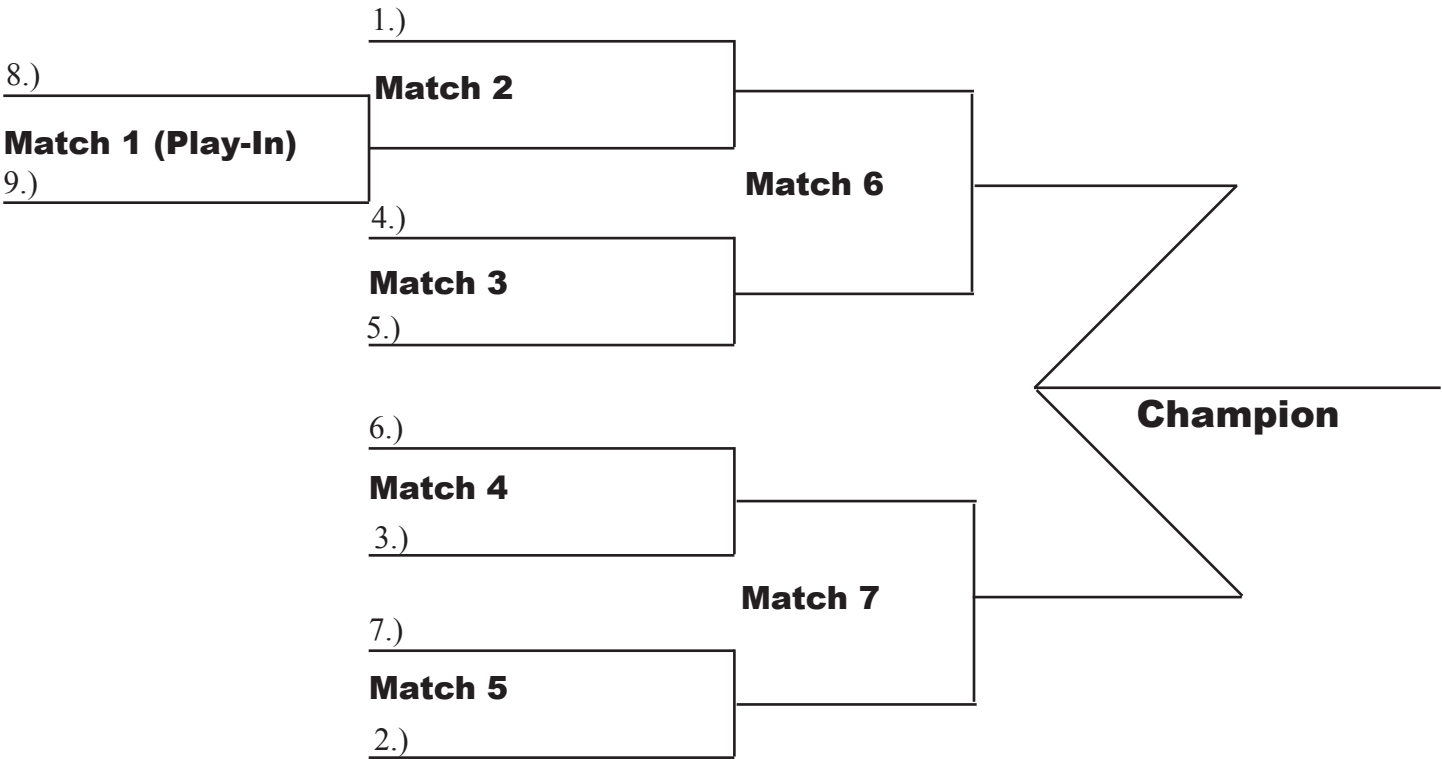

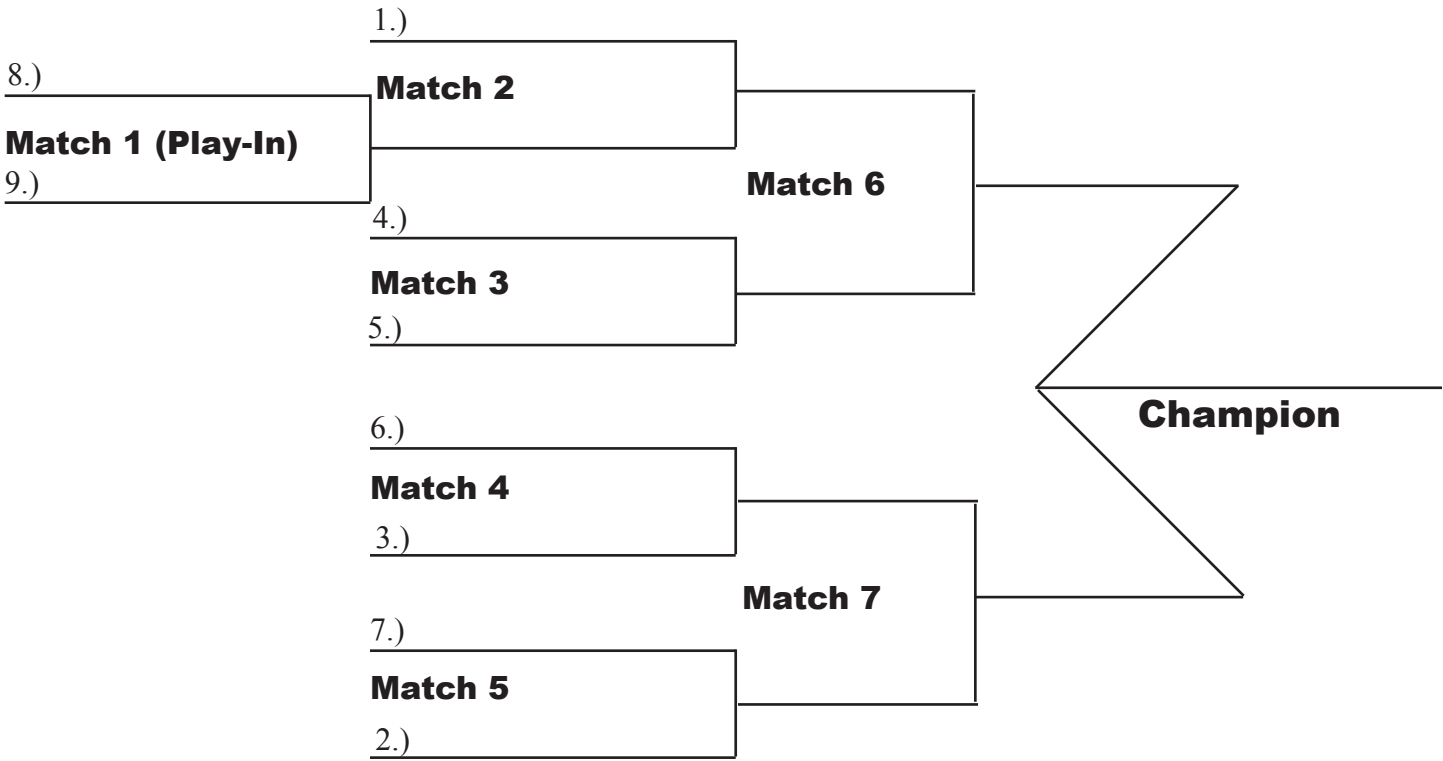

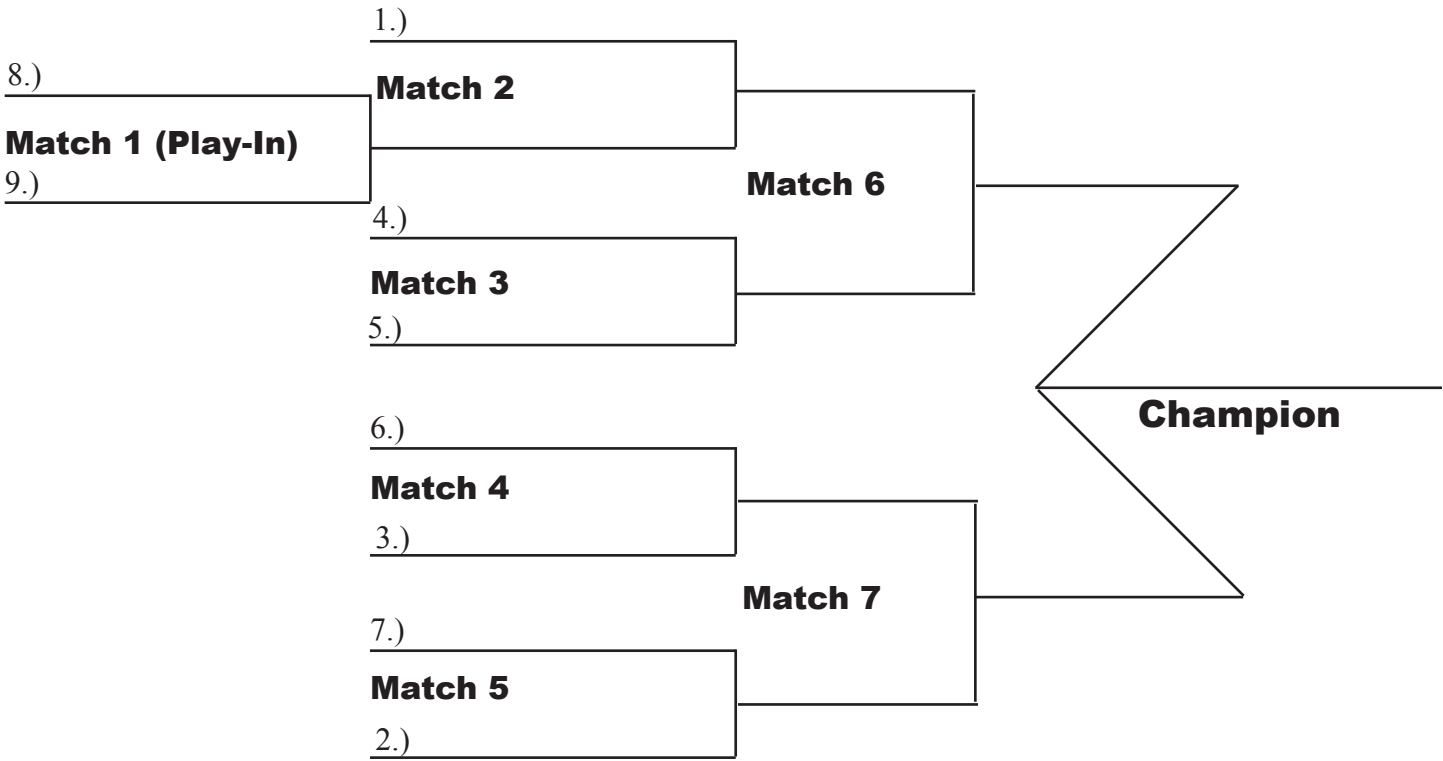

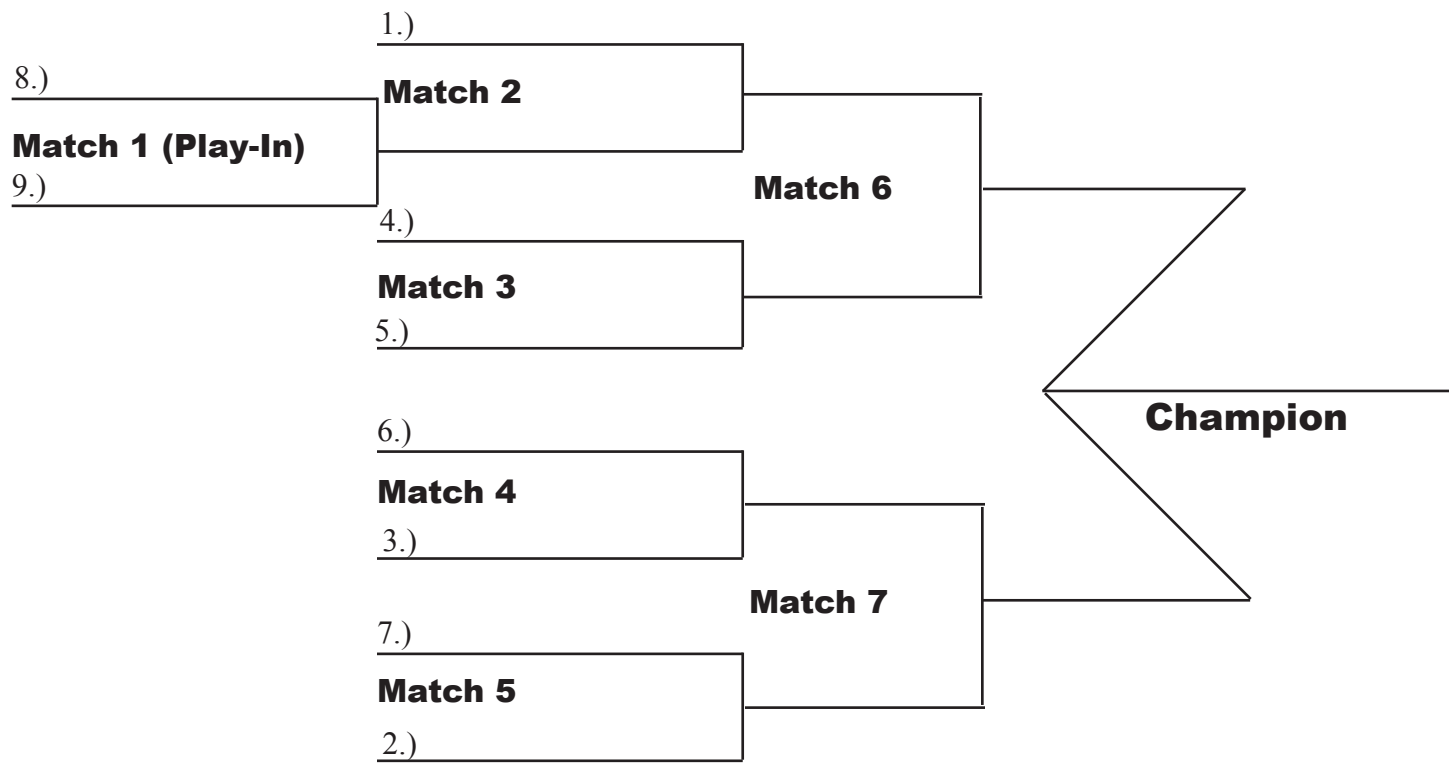
