Welcome to the 2017 College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) Women's Tennis Championship.

The CCIW enters the 2017-18 academic year as its 72nd season of competition, 32nd for women's sports.

During the 2016-17 academic year, the CCIW honored over 1,900 academic all-conference recipients, 10 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, 33 CoSIDA Academic All-District recipients, one CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year and over 100 all-Americans.

The CCIW, recognized as one of the "Best Small-College Conferences in the Nation," has seen its share of success throughout its time, with 50 NCAA Division III National Championships in 11 different sports won by the membership.

Since the 1991-92 academic year, the CCIW has remained consistent in its membership and welcomed back another former member in 2016-17. The CCIW consists of nine institutions, including Augustana, Carroll, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois Wesleyan, Millikin, North Central, North Park and

Wheaton. Carroll returned to the conference in 2016-17 after a 24-year absence.



Teams are credited with two points for a first-round win, four points for a second-round win and three points for a win in the championship. No points are awarded for play-in match wins.


Teams are credited with one point for winning a match in the playback bracket.

Teams are credited with two points for winning a third-place match.



Teams will then be awarded points for where they finish in the CCIW championship standings (a team's place in the CCIW championship standings will be determined using the point system listed above). This will account for two-thirds of the criteria. The top four teams will advance to the CCIW Automatic Qualifier Tournament in May.



Championship Bracket - Number One Singles









Championship Bracket - Number Four Singles




Playback Bracket - Number Four Singles






Championship Bracket - Number Five Singles









Championship Bracket - Number One Doubles








Championship Bracket - Number Two Doubles





CCIW schools have accounted for 50 national championships at the NCAA Division III level since the NCAA divided into three divisions in 1973. Three women's national titles were won before the CCIW began sponsoring women's athletics in 1986.


